New Developments

- The College of Medicine was granted provisional accreditation in June 2011 and will be reviewed again October 2012 for a recommendation of full accreditation
- UCF Pegasus Health, the College of Medicine's new faculty practice began treating patients in November 2011
- The College of Medicine began its first Health Leaders initiative with Orlando's Jones High School Medical Arts Magnet program, a partnership designed to increase the diversity of students in medical education and better prepare them to enter the health-care profession
- The Class of 2013 has entered their fourth, and final, year at the College of Medicine, working in partnership hospitals, clinics and other healthcare centers to gain real-world experience and in doing so discover their specialty of choice for their upcoming residencies
- In February 2011, UCF purchased 25 acres of land next to the Health Sciences Campus in Lake Nona for a teaching hospital that will be next door to the medical school
