Effective for the catalog year 2020-2021, students who declare Biomedical Sciences as their undergraduate degree will need to complete the following courses with a minimum grade of a "C" prior to transitioning from "Pending" into their major:

- BSC 2010C Biology 1*
- CHM 2045C Chemistry 1*/**
- CHM 2046 Chemistry 2*
- CHM 2210 Organic 1

Important note: All majors under the College of Medicine, Burnett School of Biomedical Sciences will be subject to a Progress Policy effective for the catalog year 2020-2021:

- The goal of this policy is to help guide students who are not progressing well in academic majors offered by COM and assist them in finding a path for success at UCF:
 - o <u>Withdrawal Component</u>:
 - Students with 3 withdrawal (W) grades will be placed in a probationary status due to lack of academic progress with the college.
 - Students with 5 withdrawal (W) grades will then be encouraged to meet with an advisor from the Knights Student Success Center (KSSC) for selection of a different major.
 - Medical withdrawals are not included in this withdrawal component.
 - Low Grade Component:
 - Students who have 5 low grades (C-, D, F, W, NC, U) will be placed on a probationary status due to lack of academic progress and will be encouraged to meet with a peer mentor for major advising.
 - Students who earn more than 8 low grades (C-, D, F, W, NC, U), will then be encouraged to meet with an advisor from Knights Student Success Center (KSSC) for selection of a different major.
 - Repeat Course Component:
 - Students with 2 unsuccessful attempts of the same UCF course will be placed on a probationary status due to lack of academic progress and will be encouraged to meet with a peer mentor for major advising.
 - Students with 3 unsuccessful attempts of the same UCF course will then be encouraged to meet with an advisor from the Knights Student Success Center (KSSC) for selection of a different major.
- More details on the internal policies, logistics, tracking and who will be the point person for the progress policy enforcement will be determined in early 2020.
