What is it: A computer-based software suite that allows you to create Self Learning Modules (SLMs) that students can view online

Where is it: Multiple computers in the FCC including laptops available for check-out

How to use it:

- Bring a PowerPoint with content to the FCC
- Talk with an Ed Tech staff member about suggestions for incorporating interactions and quizzes into the SLM (if desired)
- Narrate the slides (if desired)
- Publish the SLM (ask staff for assistance)
- Provide published SLM to coordinator to have placed in Webcourses

Possible applications:

- As a way to replace an in-class lecture
- As a way to present content to students prior to class (e.g. like a reading assignment)

Best Practices:

- List learning objectives early in the SLM
- If you narrate, make sure your narration references/relates to text on the screen
- Each SLM should address only 1 -3 learning objectives (think “small chunks”)

Pros:

- Easy to use
- Can work with existing PowerPoint slides
- Powerful - can add interactions, quiz questions, videos, and narrations
- HTML5 and mobile friendly

Cons:

- Cannot track or store data (e.g. quiz results, number of times viewed, and length of time, etc.)
- iPad playback is not available when uploaded to Webcourses
