## Immunization Information **REQUIRED** for you to proceed with registration at UCF COM

The following page lists the immunizations required by UCF COM. UCF COM will accept the following as satisfactory documentation of proof of vaccination:

- 1. the official State of Florida Immunization form, issued by local health departments and physicians' offices, or
- 2. documentation from your physician.

An official stamp from a doctor's office, clinic or health department **and** an authorized signature must appear on the official document(s) submitted or your immunizations will not be approved. **Please note** – there are some vaccines that require a **lab report** copy as proof of vaccination. Please do not hesitate to contact the Office of Student Affairs at (407) 266-1353 with any questions about immunizations.

If there is a history of positive PPD: Documentation of a current chest x-ray and the tuberculosis screening questionnaire is required for all persons with a history of a positive PPD skin test (within past twelve months). Alternatively, Quantiferon-Gold TB test is also acceptable for those students with a history of a positive PPD. 	Meningococcal vaccine is also recommended if you have a complement component immune deficiency, lack of a spleen, HIV, or for travel to areas of the world with high prevalence of meningococcal disease.
