Pediatrics

- Required:
 - Acting Internship in Pediatrics or neonatology MDI 8400, 8461, 8463, 8490
- Recommended:
 - o Emergency medicine elective
 - o Critical care elective
 - Psychiatry elective
 - o Pathology and laboratory medicine elective
 - Pediatric Radiology elective
 - Pediatric electives: Hematology Oncology, Congenital Cardiology, Genetics, Development, Endocrine, nephrology, pulmonology, gastroenterology, ID, orthopedics, ENT, pediatric maxillofacial

Psychiatry

- One or two AWAY rotations in Psychiatry at sites you are interested in applying to for residency; for example, an inpatient Psychiatry, Emergency Psychiatry, or a Consultation Liaison Psychiatry rotation.
- An Al in Psychiatry COM: either at Orlando V.A. Domiciliary (residential care with approximate 60-180 day length of stay), or Orlando V.A. Triage Clinic (outpatient walk-in clinic).
- Alternatively, one of the COM M4 Psychiatry electives: Child Psychiatry (Nemours), UCF PTSD Clinic, Coastal Mental Health (outpatient clinics), Pasadena Villa (residential care with length of stay of several months), or Circles of Care (inpatient and/or outpatient, in Melbourne).
- Remember: no more than a total of 4 electives can be in Psychiatry during the M4 year.
- Either an AI or elective in Neurology.
- Either an AI and/or elective in:
 - Internal Medicine or one of its subspecialties. Could substitute Pediatrics if you are interested in going into Child & Adolescent Psychiatry
 - Emergency Medicine

- Radiology (especially Neuroradiology)
- Other rotations as discussed with your specialty advisor.

Emergency Medicine

- Required:
 - Al Emergency Medicine at UCF: Perform at either site with an accredited EM program. Get a SLOE (Standardized Letter of Evaluation).
 - Second EM rotation: Can perform here or away. Choose a site with an accredited EM program to get another SLOE.
- Highly Recommended:
 - Critical Care AI: Choose any subset of critical care.
 - EM based research: This could be done as a FIRE project or any other time during school. Again, choosing a mentor from an accredited EM program will give you most bang for buck. Your goal should be a national presentation or peer-reviewed publication. This does not have to be a rotation.
 - Other high yield rotations: Pediatric EM, Ultrasound, Radiology, Anesthesia.
- Recommended:
 - Consider a 3rd EM rotation from an accredited program especially if you have geographic limitations, other circumstances that may make things more complicated. Discuss this with advisor. Get SLOE.
 - Other electives: Cardiology, Orthopedics, Ophthalmology, ENT, Dermatology, EKG.
- Other:
 - Become active in EM interest group.
 - Join ACEP/EMRA.
 - o Consider going to EM conference: FCEP has a local weekend conference in
 - August each year in which all FL residencies show up and compete in CPC.
 - o SAEM, ACEP, AAEM all have national as well as regional conferences.
