## Vision

The University of Central Florida College of Medicine will be the nation's premier 21st century college of medicine—a national leader in education, research and patient care, recognized for supporting and empowering its students and faculty to realize their passion for discovery, healing, health and life, and for its ability to create partnerships to transform medical education and health care.

## New Developments

- The College of Medicine was granted full accreditation in February 2013 by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, which accredit all medical schools in the United States and Canada
- In 2016, when the college reaches full enrollment, it will be educating 480 doctors-in-training a year
- UCF Pegasus Health, the College of Medicine's faculty practice, offers primary and specialty care under one roof to patients across the community
- Selected areas of specialty for the charter class of 2013 include primary care, ophthalmology, emergency medicine, diagnostic radiology, pediatrics, obstetrics-gynecology, surgery and psychiatry
- The college's Burnett School of Biomedical Sciences conducts cutting-edge medical research focusing on global health concerns —cancer, cardiovascular, neurodegenerative, and infectious diseases.

### COLLEGE OF MEDICINE AND MEDICAL CITY ECONOMIC IMPACT

According to a 2008 economic impact study\*, the college, combined with the life sciences cluster, by year 2017 will create:

- 30,000 jobs
- \$460 million in annual tax revenue
- \$2.8 billion in annual wages
- \$7.6 billion in annual economic activity
- \$13.50 in economic activity for every government dollar spent (a 1,350% return on investment)

## UCF at a Glance

- 12 colleges, offering 177 bachelor's and master's degrees, and 30 doctoral programs
- 2nd-largest public university in the nation Kiplinger's and The Princeton Review ranked a UCF education as one of the nation's best values in 2012-13
- UCF produced the second-largest number of STEM graduate in the State University System of Florida
- 48% of UCF students graduated without educational debt. Nationally, 33% of students graduate debt-free
- A UCF-record \$55 million grant from NASA was awarded
- UCF researcher earned more than \$1.1 billion in external grants during the past decade, and their work creates an addition 3,800 jobs annually
- UCF won the inaugural American Athletic Conference titles in women's soccer and football and was the youngest university to ever play in a BCS bowl game
