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What is the purpose of the Student Professional Conduct Council (SPCC)?

The UCF COM MD program Honor Code characterizes the moral, ethical, and professional values embodied by our profession and entrusted upon us as medical students and future physicians. The SPCC oversees the implementation of the Honor code with emphasis on maintaining the values intrinsic to our role as physicians, community leaders, and medical students, namely those of integrity, professionalism, judgment, and respect. The SPCC is provided with an advisor from Student Affairs (Dr. Marcy Verduin) and is composed of two student representatives from each class with one designated as a primary and one as an alternate.

How do I relate a concern to the SPCC?

Confidentiality of these procedures is of the utmost importance. Individuals aware of a suspected violation of the Honor Code are responsible for reporting it to an SPCC representative within 5 business days of learning of the event. The SPCC representative initially contacted will meet with the SPCC Chair and the Associate Dean for Students to discuss the merits of the reported violation and to take necessary steps as specified by SPCC policies and procedures.
