Changes in the AAMC Annual Meeting

2014 Meeting

- There will be no Group on Educational Affairs workshops at the meeting.
- RIME research papers will still be reviewed and accepted for the 2014 meeting, however accepted research will not be presented at the main meeting. Accepted authors will be given the option of presenting a webinar (hosted by the AAMC), podcast, blog post, audio interview or poster. The research paper will still be published in the November 2014 edition of Academic Medicine.
- RIME posters will still be reviewed and accepted but will be presented at a general poster session that includes constituents from all groups (not limited to GEA/RIME)
- There will be no RIME Oral Presentation (short, 15 minute, pilot programs) format in the program.

2015 Meeting(s)

- The Group on Educational Affairs will have its own meeting separate from the AAMC Annual Meeting.
- While not clearly defined yet, the planning committee hopes to incorporate similar programming (RIME research, oral presentations, posters, GEA workshops) along with new formats.
- The meeting will occur in September or October each year.
- Regional GEA (many of us participate in SGEA) meetings will remain in the spring and will not change.
