	<ul> <li>"If an M3 clerkship student fails the NBME Shelf Exam, the student must remediate and will not be eligible for an "A" final grade in that clerkship."</li> <li>"If an M3 clerkship student unsuccessfully remediates the NBME Shelf Exam, i.e., fails the exam more than once, the student will receive an "F" and will need to repeat the clerkship."</li> </ul>			
Theoretical Discussion	<ul> <li>Discussion of recent research regarding the pros and cons of moving to simple Pass/Fail Grading in the M3 clerkships.</li> <li>Pros of going to pass/fail system: eliminates grade inflation, decreases undue competition between students, allows student to work more collaboratively, more focused on content and procedures as opposed to focusing on the final grade.</li> <li>Cons of moving to pass/fail – grades are sometimes used to determine who receives residency interviews.</li> <li>CTAG has been looking at grading and grade distribution.</li> <li>Any indicated remediation should ideally be discussed during mid-clerkship meetings of the student with faculty</li> <li>Using Pass/Fail in the M3 year would have a major impact on the student GPA due to only having letter grades in the M1 and M2 year.</li> </ul>		Drs.
