The Resident as Teacher (RAT) program is designed to fulfill the educational and program requirements of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) and Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME).

Our program trains residents in teaching skills, which are essential to training medical students and delivering patient education. Every year the Resident as Teacher program delivers an overview of the specific clerkship objectives and policies, in addition to other sessions.

- ❖ Reinforces concepts used in daily training with learners
- ❖ Promotes discussions and skills practice
- ❖ Mandatory Clerkship Orientation session that includes a focus on reviewing the clerkship objectives and policies, while discussing the Resident's role with our learners
- ❖ Module completion is tracked, certificate of completion is awarded at end of series
