Yantalo Peru Foundation

The Yantalo Peru Foundation was founded by the Vasquez family in 2005. The foundation has grown into a robust volunteer organization that delivers outstanding quality programs in health, education, and culture to the people of Yantalo in the Peruvian Amazon Jungle. The foundation provides sustainable, organized and modern inpatient and outpatient clinics as well as a full operating room that is ready for volunteers to provide top of the line care to patients in need. MedPACt has joined forces with nursing, physical therapy, social work and pharmacy students as well as a group of physician volunteers to provide quality interdisciplinary care in the clinic on a yearly basis. The foundation's mission is to create a long-term positive impact on the people of Peru primarily through the improvement of health and quality of life from the first sustainably designed medical clinic in South America.





IPEC Competencies

In 2009, the Interprofessional Education Collaborative (IPEC) established 4 competencies to guide the practice of interprofessional education:

- Values and Ethics for Interprofessional Practice
- Roles and Responsibilities
- Interprofessional Communication
- Teams and Teamwork


The competencies are immediately relevant on international service trips, like Yantalo, Peru, where students and faculty across disciplines are brought together to serve a culturally and linguistically distinct community. All care is provided on interdisciplinary teams in a uniquely collaborative environment. In addition to the service learning opportunity, cultivation of IPEC competencies among the care teams in Yantalo provide students with valuable skills.

Demographics of Yantalo

The Yantalo foundation provides healthcare services to men, women and children, incorporating the entire spectrum of age and development. Most patients are Spanish speaking natives with physically demanding occupations, primarily farm and field workers. Many patients travel long distances, up to seven-hour journeys, to receive care from this clinic.


The Yantalo foundation announces months in advance which services will be available so residents can plan for their visits. An efficient intake team performs vitals and determines what specialized care the patient needs, referring them to one of the medical, surgical, physical therapy, or social work teams. The Yantalo Clinic has in-house laboratory and ultrasound diagnostics. The majority of patients seeking care were seen by more than one discipline. An educational initiative focused on sexual and reproductive health was also run by the UCF team for school aged children in the neighboring town.


Continuity of Care

The Yantalo Foundation has a team of medical professionals dedicated to providing year-round care for every patient who is seen at the clinic. Although the volunteer teams can only be at the clinic for limited periods of time, patients can still receive care from the in-house physicians, nurses and laboratory staff present at the clinic. We strive to ensure continuity of care through maintaining detailed notes on every clinical encounter and surgery. Records of medications and necessary follow-up appointments are maintained in a secure and user-friendly electronic health record that can be easily accessed by future volunteer organizations or the in-house staff if further care is needed. We aim to build relationships with local care staff and the community by returning to Yantalo yearly.


IPE Survey of Student Volunteers


