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Agenda Item	there are only vague guidelines available. Students have been told that there is a 98% chance that it will be held virtually.  There were also several concerns brought up if capstone does require in person elements:  When can students expect to know if they will be required to be in person (i.e. days of the week, specialties, etc.)? OBGYN, Family Medicine, Emergency Medicine, and Surgery will have one face-to-face session.  Will a covid test or quarantine be required? Does receiving the vaccine negate the need for this? Quarantining is not necessary for "fully vaccinated" people within three months of having received their last doses as long as they do not develop any symptoms. "Fully vaccinated" means that at least two weeks have passed since a person has received the second dose of a two-dose vaccine or one dose of a single-dose vaccine. All students should be "fully vaccinated" by the time of the M4 Capstone.
