# YEAR OF ACHIEVEMENT

#### **Training Opportunities**

Our Scholarly Communications Librarian introduced new training for faculty and students on topics related to scholarly publishing, including one-on -one Endnote training, and a Getting Published workshop. Additional trainings are planned for the 2019 year.



#### Distinguished Library **Award**

The library received the Consortium of Biomedical Libraries of the South (CONBLS) Distinguished Library Award in October for its long-standing "HSL Info Expo" outreach program aimed at faculty and staff at the COM. The library was previously honored with the same award in 2011 for its iPad program within the medical education program.



#### Librarian Promotion

Pammy Herring, MLIS, AHIP, was successfully promoted to Assistant Librarian during the 2018 promotion cycle. She also received the Excellence in Medical Librarianship award during the 2018 MD Program Awards ceremony in November.

#### **Sharing Our Expertise**

Our Public Services team had the opportunity to create and present a continuing education webinar and a 4-hour continuing education workshop on how to promote and develop creative library programs and services. Three hundred and twenty two participants claimed credit for the live webinar and the recording is available for future participants. The workshop was taught to five librarians at the 2018 SCMLA annual meeting in October.

#### Service to the Profession

The library team provided valuable assistance as the Local Arrangements committee by hosting the 2018 annual meeting for the Southern Chapter of the Medical Library Association (SCMLA). The meeting was held at the Wyndham Lake Buena Vista Resort in Orlando in October. The library helped negotiate venue pricing, create registration materials, serve as exhibitor liaison, and provide décor for the closing banquet.
