COVID updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Dean spoke to both M1 and M2 classes <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● UCF COM is designated as an extended clinical space by the Dean in her role as the Chief Medical Officer – masks are mandated while inside COM ● Presentations from Dr. Elena Cyrus on COVID ● Many of our clinical affiliates have vaccine mandates for trainees ● Email to all 4 classes regarding credentialing requirement of clinical partners ● COVID hotline remains point of contact for staff, students, and faculty with exposures, symptoms, or positive tests ● Procedures for students on COVID protocol <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Falls under standard medical absence policy – out for session itself. Not penalized for missing, and generally given access to content in question when possible. ● Working with assessment on remote exams if it becomes necessary for students in quarantine 	●
HB2 assessment change	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Testing anatomy knowledge for students ● Current – Afternoon before practical setup, logistics of practical itself + grading, time limitation rotating students through the practical ● Proposed – Summative opportunities in lab, ask higher-order questions on the anatomy itself, while removing the fill-in-blank questions. This will be a component of final exam score. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Summative anatomy assessment will also include midterm and TBL components ● Evaluating success of the change <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Student feedback ● Summative exam performance, student performance on image question, lab software and knowledge questions 	●
