### MEDICAL STUDENT PROCESS TO REPORT ANY EXPOSURE AT HCA FLORIDA OCALA HOSPITAL

## CLEAN AFFECTED AREA IMMEDIATELY

Intact Skin: Wash with soap and water.

Non-Intact Skin, Needlestick or Cut:

Wash with soap and water, Do not squeeze area and do not apply dermabond.

Mouth: Rinse well with water.

Eyes: Rinse with steril water, saline or

tap water.

#### **REPORT TO YOUR SUPERVISOR**

\*Report incident immediately to your Direct Supervisor (e.g. Attending, Chief Resident, Senior Resident)

\*Sign-off clinical duties to Resident or Attending

# For Needlstick/Blood Exposure OBTAIN LABS ON SOURCE PATIENT

\* Contact the Nursing Supervisor at 352-401-1184 and request an order for "Needlestick" Labs on the Source Patient. Make sure Nursing Supervisor has your cell number.

\*Contact Student Health Services at UCF.

Source Patient results will be reported to the Nursing Supervisor within 48 hours.



#### **MEDICAL CARE**

#### **During Regular Business Hours**

If urgent care is needed, go to the Emergency Department, otherwise the Program Coordinator can direct you to an Urgent Care Center for treatment.

After Hours: Go to the Emergency Dept for treatment.

#### Insurance

Provide ED or Urgent Care Center with your personal Medical Student Health Insurance Policy Information.

#### INFORM PROGRAM COORDINATOR

#### **During Regular Business hours**

Go to your Program Coordinator to complete the Exposure/Needlestick Report Form. If after hours, report to the PC the following business day.



#### **FOLLOW UP**
