## Approval of Minutes

#### Policy Revisions in Response to HB 233

- Ms. Schreiber and Ms. Am, from the legal office at COM, shared the following changes and highlights. This will be presented again at CCom for approval once it is approved by UCF Main Campus.
  - Removed yellow/red cards and replacing with professionalism citations
  - Defined "professionalism"
  - > Incorporated due process requirements required by law for conduct and discipline
  - Coordinated with UCF due process regulations
  - Separated processes for:
    - o Grade appeal
    - o Professionalism citation
    - o SEPC action
    - o Student misconduct
  - New COM M.D. Program Student Conduct Code, removed Honor Code language
  - New Student Conduct Review Committee
    - Comprised of the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs or designee, who shall serve as Chair; two (2) core faculty members of the COM, appointed by the Chair; and two (2) Student Professional Conduct Council Representatives, appointed by the Associate Dean for Students.

- > Applicable to conduct violations, including academic misconduct
  - Not applied to academic/professionalism issues
- Students' rights to:
  - o notice
  - o preponderance of the evidence standard
  - o remain silent, avoid self-incrimination
  - an advisor, advocate, or legal representative, at their own expense and initiative, who can fully participate in the disciplinary proceeding
  - o present relevant information and question witnesses
  - o appeal the final decision of the hearing officer
  - o obtain copy of the record
- > Title IX and criminal matters continue to be referred to main campus
- COM Student Conduct Review Committee will hear most other conduct matters at COM

- M1s:

# M1/M2 Subcommittee - Dr. Kauffman

- Members approved to switch the order of the Skin and MSK module (S5) and Brain and Behavior module (S6). The Skin and MSK module will begin right after the winter holiday and three weeks later the Brain and Behavior module will begin.
- Members approved the AY 2023-24 Exam Calendar.

## M3/M4 Subcommittee - Dr. Pasarica

- The following course proposals were approved by members.
  - Pharmacovigilance and Adverse Drug Reaction Reporting
  - > Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Physiatry Rotation
- The grading rubrics for the 22-23 IM/FM, 23-24 IM/FM, 23-24 OB-GYN, 23-24 Psychiatry, and 23-24 Surgery were approved.
  - IM/FM: Added an OSCE component that was taken away during the pandemic and total points for honors were decreased from 93 to 92.
  - > **OB-GYN:** Added an H&P to replace one case presentation for 10%.
  - Psychiatry: Added direct observation to replace the clinical skills evaluation and H&P weight was increased to 25%. Total points for honors were decreased to 94%.
  - Surgery: Added a graded H&P for 5% to replace a case report.
- The Neurology rubric was tabled. Committee recommended the following prior to approval.
  - o clarify wording to the peer assessment
  - o correct typo

#### PES Recommendations - Dr. Harris

- Clarification was made to the following FIRE modules recommendation.
  - Work with HCA team (Dr. Katy Robison & Co) to partner residents and faculty at HCA with FIRE students: The mentor will still be a faculty member (from HCA in this case) but would also include a resident to provide access to the HCA databases for retrospective data analysis studies.
